Nate Boulton Files for Re-Election to Iowa Senate

“There is so much more we must do to better prepare our state for the future.”

DES MOINES – Joined by his wife Andrea and six-month-old baby daughter Gwyneth, State Senator Nate Boulton filed his papers for re-election to the Iowa Senate at the State Capitol today. “It has been an honor to serve in the Iowa Senate and represent my constituents in Des Moines and Pleasant Hill at the Capitol. While I’m proud of what I have been able to do in the Iowa Senate over the past four years, there are so many important issues and ideas that still need to be accomplished. There is so much more we must do to better prepare our state for the future.”

During his first term, Boulton has made workplace rights and civil justice clear priorities. In 2017, he took the lead in fighting against legislation that took away public employee rights and limited recoveries for injured workers and victims of medical malpractice. Boulton also has taken action in filing legislation, including bills for paid family leave and workplace accommodations for pregnancies.

Despite being in the minority party, so far in 2020 Boulton’s major bills to require insurance coverage for children with a neuropsychological illness, to help children of divorce deal with college tuition expenses, and to address unfair limitations on college athletes’ rights to their own names, images, and likenesses have all been approved by subcommittees and committees with bipartisan support and are awaiting consideration by the full Senate. Another bill, dealing with workers’ compensation coverage for persons who have lost limbs in workplace accidents and need replacement of prosthetics, was advanced unanimously by a subcommittee earlier in the session.

“Working people in Iowa need a strong advocate—someone who can stand up with them and for them. Someone who can work across the aisle and do so without compromising on core beliefs. I’ve worked to be that advocate throughout my first term and look forward to continuing that work in the years to come.”
